ITINERARY (DAY BY DAY):

DAY 1: JOMO KENYATTA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT TO NAIROBI 215.6KM

Guest will be picked up at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport and depart to Nairobi which is situated in along the Nairobi River in beautiful Kenya, the capital of Nairobi is East Africa's most cosmopolitan city. It serves as an excellent starting point for African safari trips around Kenya. Nairobi is Africa's 4th largest city and is a vibrant and exciting place, and although it has developed a reputation which keeps tourist visits brief, there are some fascinating attractions. Guest will take advantage of a private vehicle and guide to explore Nairobi National Park and other points of interest.


DAY 2: NAIROBI AREA

This day after breakfast guide will pick you up and escort you to Daphne Sheldrick's Elephant Sanctuary. Guest will admire the playful nature of these young elephants and experience a close encounter with giants of the African wilderness. Next, we move on to the Giraffe Sanctuary to see the rare Rothschild's Giraffe before proceeding for lunch at the Ololo Safari Lodge. Afternoon at leisure Dinner and overnight at Ololo Safari Lodge meal plan Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner

Overnight: Sentrim Boulevard Hotel

Sentrim Boulevard Hotel is conveniently located at the end of Harry Thuku Road, a short distance away from Nairobi's busy central business district. Accommodation consists of a variety of guest rooms, each equipped with an en-suite bathroom, a safety deposit box, a TV with satellite channels and a***** Guests can enjoy a variety of tasty African, Chinese, European and Indian dishes at the on-site restaurant. Other amenities offered are a bar, internet access, a lounge area, a swimming pool and a tennis court.







DAY 3-4: NAIROBI TO NAKURU 158.6 KM

Guest will have early breakfast and departure to Lake Nakuru whereby they will arrive around lunch. Nakuru is a city on the shores of western Kenya's Lake Nakuru, within a reserve that sprawls across almost 200 square kilometres. It is the capital of Nakuru County, located in the Great Rift Valley. Ten kilometres from town lies the massive Menengai Crater. Later in the afternoon guest will go on an afternoon game drive.

Overnight: Midland Hotel Nakuru

Midland Hotel is an integral part of Nakuru history, dating back to the 1900's. The cosmopolitan hotel retains it's old charm, in a modern setting. Set on two acres of land in the heart of Nakuru town, just off the Trans-African Highway, the facility is beautifully located for tourists, corporate clientele as well as individual travelers. All major banks and main streets are a short walk away. The hotel is situated a two hour drive away from the capital city Nairobi.



DAY 5: NAKURU TO LAKE NAIVASHA 77.3KM

Guest will have a nice breakfast and pack up to depart to Lake Naivasha which is the highest of the Great Rift Valley Lakes and despite having no outlet, it is one of only two Rift Valley freshwater lakes. This beautiful lake is fringed by papyrus and acacia trees, a unique geologic landscape and supports a vast array of over 450 bird species. It serves as the main drinking hole for wildlife in the area such as zebra, eland, hippo, waterbuck, buffalo and much more. After checking in guest will go in afternoon game drive before dinner.

Overnight: Lake Naivasha Crescent Camp





Lake Naivasha Crescent Camp is located on the shores of Lake Naivasha at the heart of the Kenyan Rift Valley and only a few minutes drive from Nairobi. The camp is constructed using canvas and has a capacity of 20 luxury tents. The tents are well furnished, have wooden floors, ensuite bathrooms with toiletries and adequate space generously created to allow free movement inside and outside at the guest's comfort. Complimentary breakfast is offered at the luxury tent, and there is also a swimming pool for fun and relaxation.








DAY 6: LAKE NAIVASHA TO TSAVO EAST NATIONAL PARK 459.6 KM

Guest will have breakfast in the morning and drive to Tsavo East National Park, which is renowned for its large number of elephants and the famous "man eating" lions. We will then arrive at Voi Safari Lodge, where you will check-in and have lunch. In the afternoon you will experience another game drive in Tsavo East before returning to the lodge for dinner and your overnight stay. **Overnight: Ashnil Aruba Lodge**









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DAY 7-8: TSAVO EAST NATIONAL PARK

This morning guest will depart on an early morning game drive before returning to the lodge for breakfast. After breakfast, they will spend the full day in Tsavo East National park in search of its popular residents, including well known predators, zebras, wildebeests, giraffes, and hippos. During the day you will enjoy a packed lunch and a visit to the Aruba Dam. This park is home to some of the largest elephant and buffalo herds in Kenya. Tsavo East boasts a rich biodiversity and is said to be one of the last remaining wildernesses. Visitors can enjoy many wonderful attractions including: River and Lugard's Falls; the magnificent Yatta Plateau; and Mudanda Rock, a natural viewpoint which overlooks a much visited and photographed drinking hole

Overnight: Ashnil Aruba Lodge

Ashnil Aruba Lodge lies in the heart of Tsavo East National Park in Kenya. Its location is superb, just a couple of hours from the coast of Mombasa, 5 hours leisurely drive from Nairobi and is located on the banks of Aruba Dam which was built in 1952 as a sport fishing recreational point in the park. Several watering holes nearby attract wildlife and spotting animals is easy because the park lies flat with savannah grassland.







DAY 9: TSAVO EAST NATIONAL PARK TO SERONERA 19KM

On this beautiful morning guest will have breakfast and depart to the Serengeti on arrival. The Seronera region, in the central Serengeti, is set directly on the Great Migration route, and offers excellent viewing of this incredible annual phenomenon, when countless wildebeest flood across the plains. Arriving at Serengeti and guest will go on a game drive to the camp.

Overnight: Mbalageti Serengeti

Mbalageti Serengeti is located in the western corridor of the Serengeti National Park, Tanzania. The Lodge offers a breath-taking 360-dgree panorama view of the Serengeti Plain lands and the Mbalageti River, where one of the main attractions is the annual migration of wildebeest and zebra.

Mbalageti is actually the word from old Maa language. It means wildebeest, but the word is no longer in use; today Mbalageti refers to the seasonal river.



DAY 10-11: SERONERA TO MANYARA NATIONAL PARK 20KM

Guest will grab breakfast and depart towards the Tarangire National Park, enjoy full day game drive with picnic lunch. The park consists of natural vegetation mainly of Acacia woodland and giant African Baobab trees, with huge swamp areas in the south. Both the river and the swamps act like a magnet for wild animals, during Tanzania's dry season. The Tarangire National Park is reputed to contain some of the largest elephant herds in Africa. This African National Park is also home to three rare species of





animals – the Greater Kudu, the Fringed-eared Oryx, as well as a few Ashy Starlings. After game drive you will drive to your camp for dinner.

Overnight: Pembeni Africa

A luxury campsite on the edge of the Ngorongoro Conservation Area. They are the ideal choice for any safari adventure in Northern Tanzania and their location gives you easy access to the Ngorongoro Crater, Lake Manyara, Tarangire and a mid-point for the Serengeti.

Whether you stay for one night or more, you can enjoy their eco-friendly environment and a traditional safari experience. The camp is built out of locally sourced materials such as wood, clay bricks and canvas and offers many facilities including hot water the entire day, full board meals, electricity with back-up generators and more creating a comfortable and relaxing stay after any adventure on your safari itinerary.



DAY 12: PEMBENI AFRICA, LAKE MANYARA NATIONAL PARK TO NAIROBI AREA 395.3KM

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Overnight: Best Western Plus Meridian Hotel

DAY 13: NAIROBI TO KAMPALA 652.8 KM

Guest will have breakfast and drive to Kampala. Kampala is Bordering the magnificent Lake Victoria, Uganda's capital city – Kampala – sprawl out over a series of undulating hills and despite the development, this 'Garden City' is known for its tree-lined avenues. This bustling city serves as the commercial hub of the country boasting a blend of African markets, modern skyscrapers, international hotels, bars, and casinos. It provides an excellent base from which to explore the surrounding area. Upon arrival guest can do a City Tour: Depending on your time of your arrival.

Guest can eat Out for lunch and Dinner: Kampala is a town full of culinary wonders. Stray out from your hotel to taste some of the eclectic cuisine of the region including Kampala's delicious Indian food.

Overnight: Speke Hotel

Speke Hotel is named after the famous British explorer, John Hannington Speke, pictured to the right, who 'discovered the source of River Nile. Speke Hotel is the first and oldest hotel in Uganda, built in the British Colonial times of the 1920s. It has, of course, gone





through renovations, but has maintained its colonial ambience. The hotel has 50 ensuite rooms which all have the modern luxury facilities that one would expect. There are also several themed restaurants (including Italian and Indian) and one of the best cocktail bars in Uganda.

The Hotel is situated in the heart of Kampala, close to the banks, shopping and business centres, and offers all the charms of bygone days complimented by efficient, modern service and facilities.

The Speke Hotel holds a special place in the history of Uganda. Come and experience the courteous hospitality so natural to the people of Uganda.



DAY 14: KAMPALA TO BWINDI NATIONAL PARK 447.7KM

Guest will be picked up in Kigali and drive to Bwindi National Park. The drive to Uganda will go through Rwanda's northern town of Ruhengeri his drive will take you approx. 4-5 hours. Guest will then cross over into Uganda via Cyanika or Katuna border post. Bwindi Impenetrable Forest is in southwestern Uganda, the Bwindi Impenetrable Forest is said to be Africa's oldest rainforest. It is world-renowned for its excellent gorilla-sighting opportunities. The rugged landscape features dense jungle, cascading waterfalls, sparkling mountain streams, deep valleys and steep ridges. Upon arrival guest will go on hiking

Overnight: Buhoma Lodge View

Nestled at the gateway to Bwindi Impenetrable Forest, Buhoma Lodge is one of only two lodges set within the national park, and is the perfect lodge of choice when embarking on your bucket-list Gorilla trekking adventure.





Renowned for its warm welcome and attentive service, guests love the homely ambience of this Africa inspired lodge. Constructed using sustainable materials, the elevated central lounge, bar and dining area (serving delicious multi-course meals) offers a cosy spot for guests to unwind, and offers amazing uninterrupted views over the forest. The crackling fireplace adds a mystical atmosphere to cooler evenings.

Tranquil and cosy, the ten spacious eco-friendly wooden chalets offer a private escape. Fall asleep to the sounds of the forest and awaken to chattering birds and monkeys as day breaks. Enjoy morning tea/coffee on your private verandah with sweeping views over the primal forest– what better way to start the day.

With Buhoma set just steps away from the trek start point, gorillas have been spotted popping in for an occasional visit, while our resident L'Hoest's monkey troup visit the gardens in front of the lodge almost daily, much to the delight of our guests.



DAY 15: BWINDI NATIONAL PARK TO KAMPALA 447.4KM

Guest will have breakfast and drive to Mabamba swamp to search for the most sought-after bird in Africa, the ancient looking Shoebill Stork along with many other birds in the Swamp. Guest You then access the swamp in local fishing boat / Canoe with a local guide.

Pack a nice lunch, take some bottled water take along a good pair of Binoculars, hat, sun protection, insect repellent, light rain jacket, long-sleeved shirt, and long trousers – all in your backpack. Mabamba Swamp is also habitat for countless of water – birds away from the Shoebill Stork such as Swamp flycatcher, African purple swamp hen, African water rail, Pallid Harrier, Papyrus Gonolek, White-winged Warbler and the Blue Swallow Common moorhen, lesser jacana, African jacana et
